GAME	INSTRUCTIONS
Pass the clap	Tables stand in a circle. 1 person starts by making eye contact with another person in the circle and clapping in their direction. The person who made eye contact with the starter receives the clap, then passes the clap in the circle.
1 Word at a Time	Table stands in a circle. The goal is to tell a story 1 person at a time, 1 word at a time. The first 4 people start with "Once upon a time", then it is made up 1 word at a time by each person.
Yes lets...	Groups or pairs. Make propositions to each other to continue the story. 1 person starts with a proposition, the next responds with "Yes, lets..." and adds to the activities.
Fortunately, unfortunately	Groups or pairs. Tell a story, with each person saying one sentence at a time. Here's the catch: each sentence must start with either "fortunately" or "unfortunately," always alternating. The first player starts out the story by saying a simple statement of fact, the next player would then add a sentence onto the story, but he has to start the sentence with "unfortunately," and so on.
